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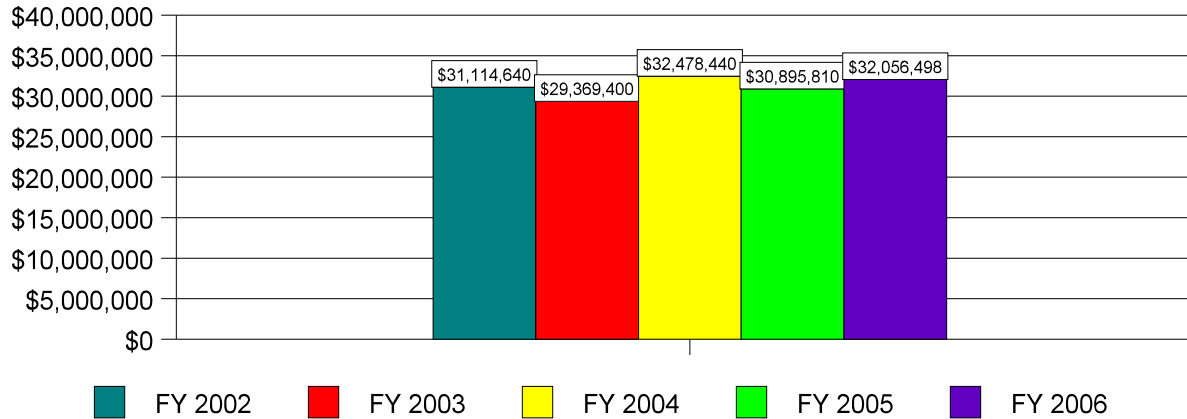
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Mississippi Student Financial Aid

FY 02 to FY 06 Dollars awarded were up 3.03%



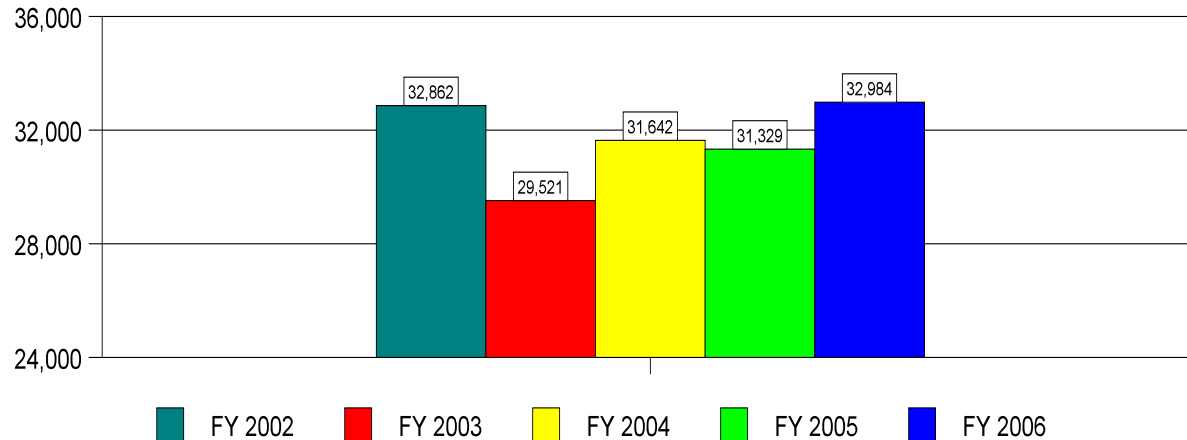
This chart reflects a comparison of expenditures for FY 2002 through FY 2006.

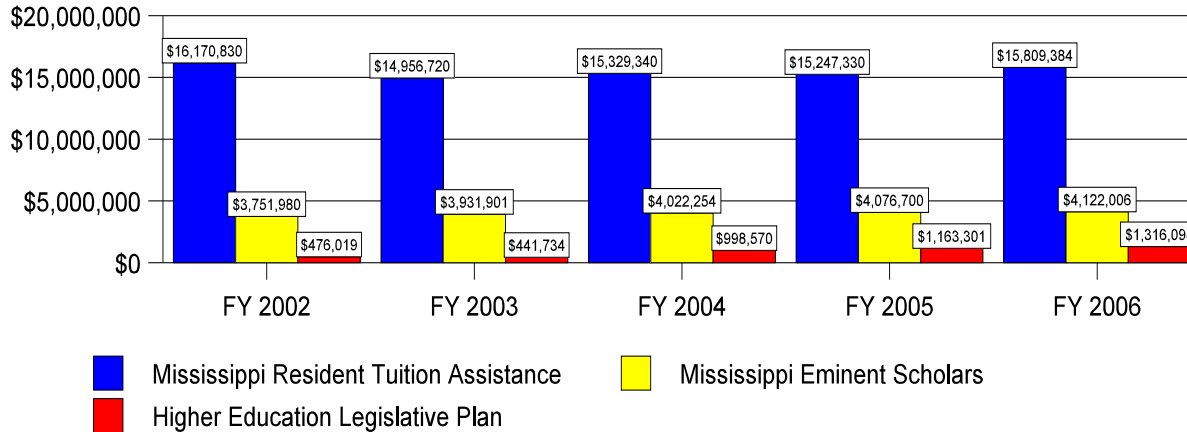
FY 02 to FY 06 Recipients were up .37%

This chart reflects a comparison of expenditures for FY 2002 through FY 2006.

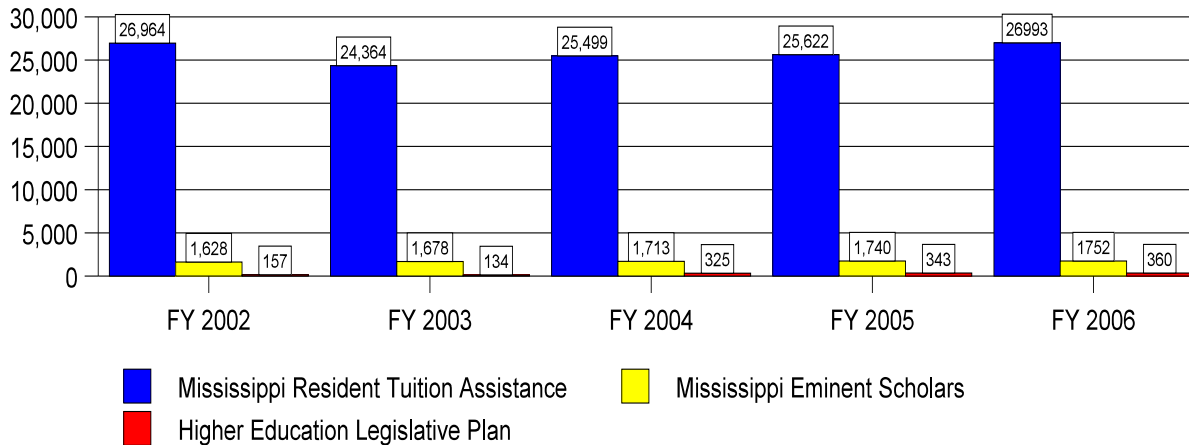

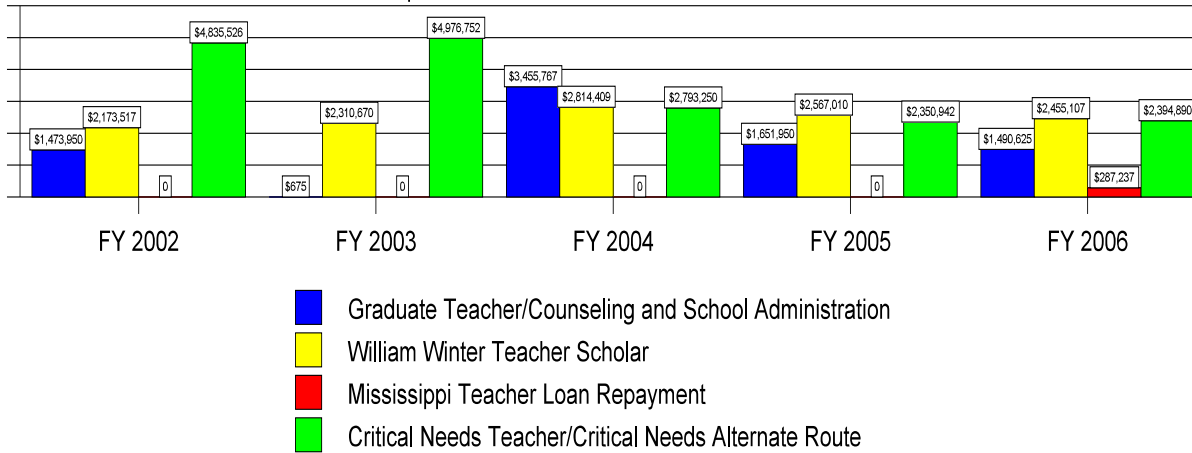
Recipients for Fiscal Years 2002 thru 2006

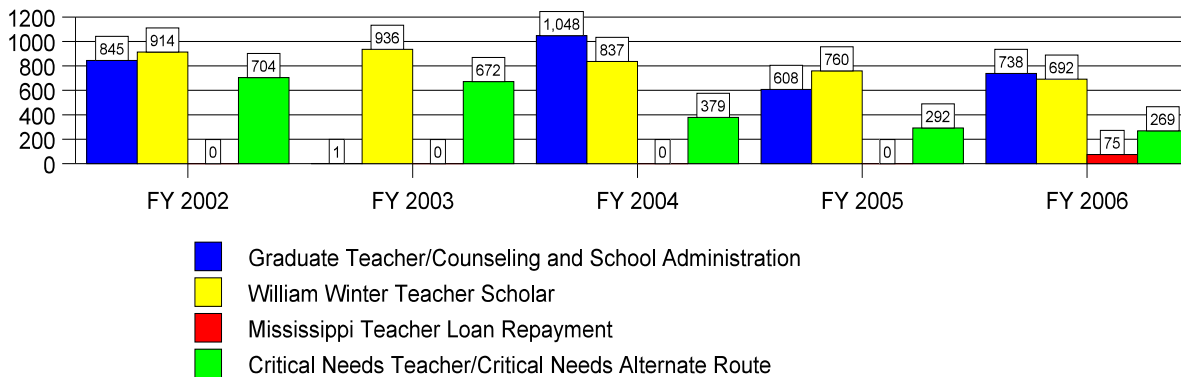

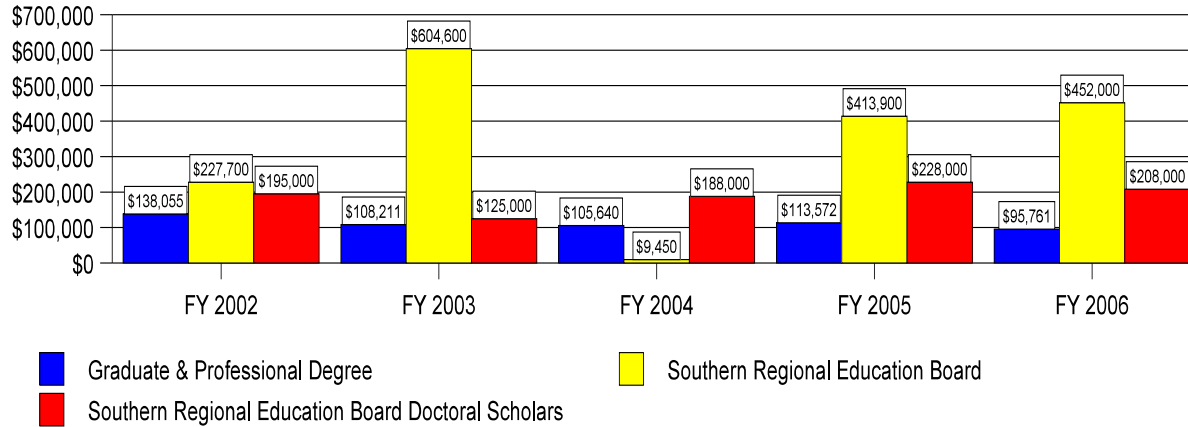
Recipients for Fiscal Years 2002 thru 2006

This chart reflects a comparison of expenditures FY 2002 through FY 2006.

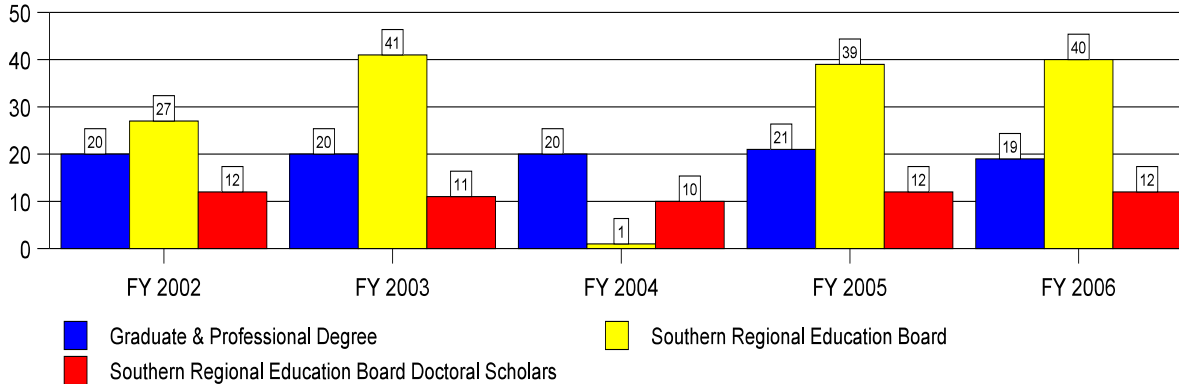

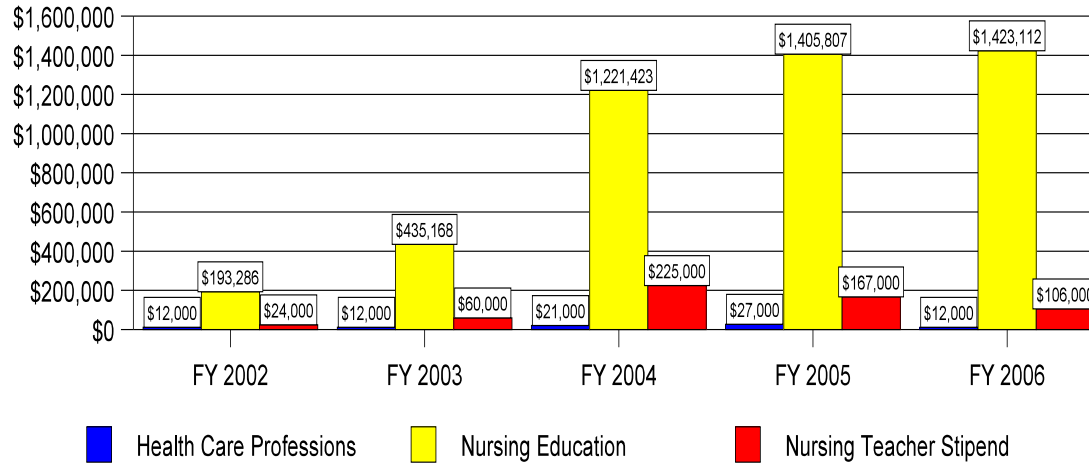
Recipients for Fiscal Years 2002 thru 2006

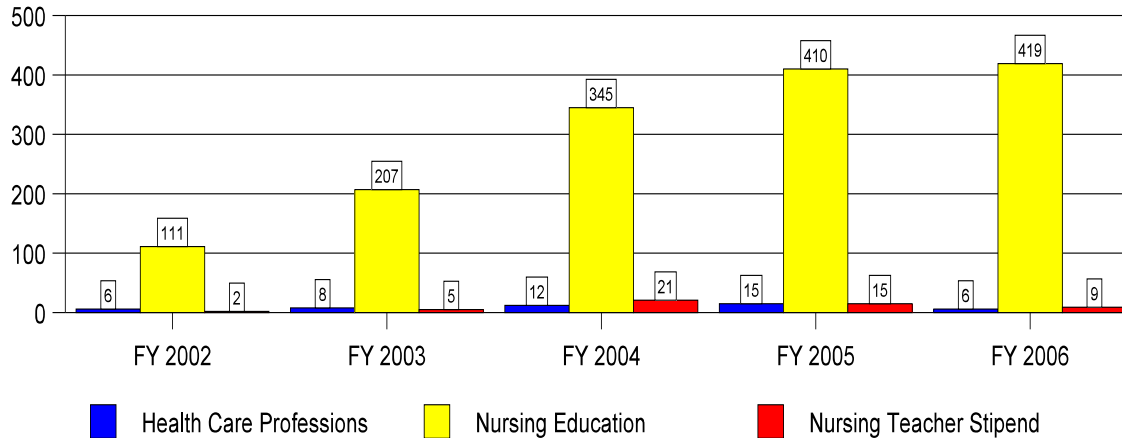

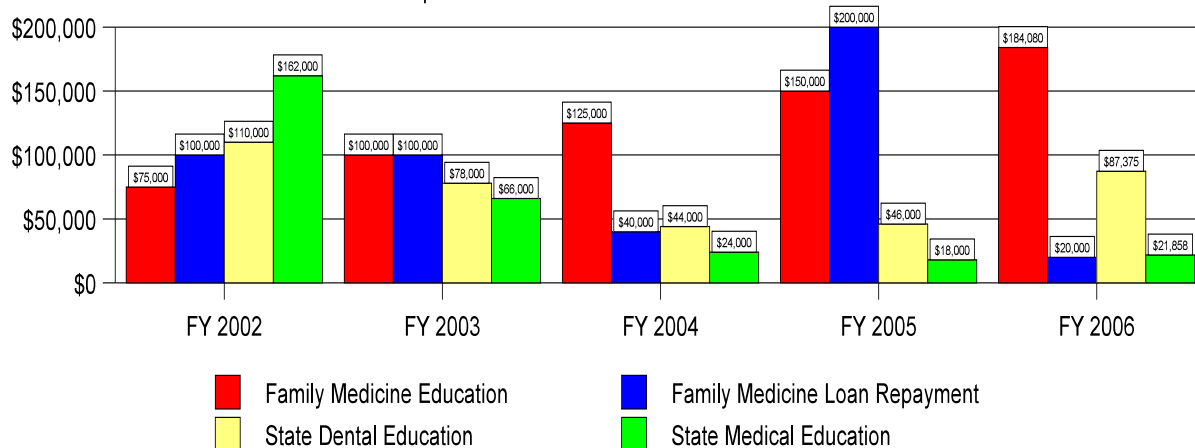
Recipients for Fiscal Years 2002 thru 2006

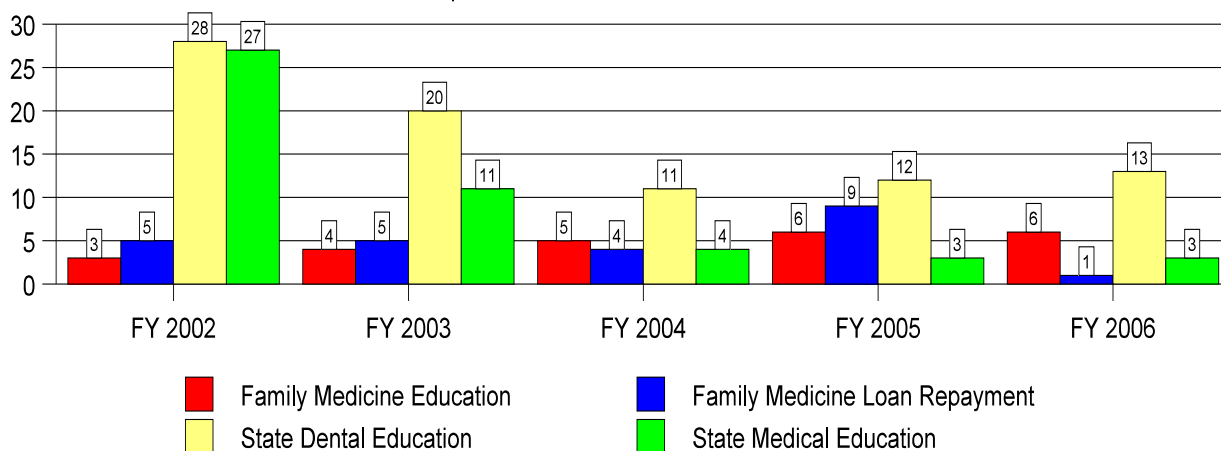

Recipients for Fiscal Years 2002 thru 2006



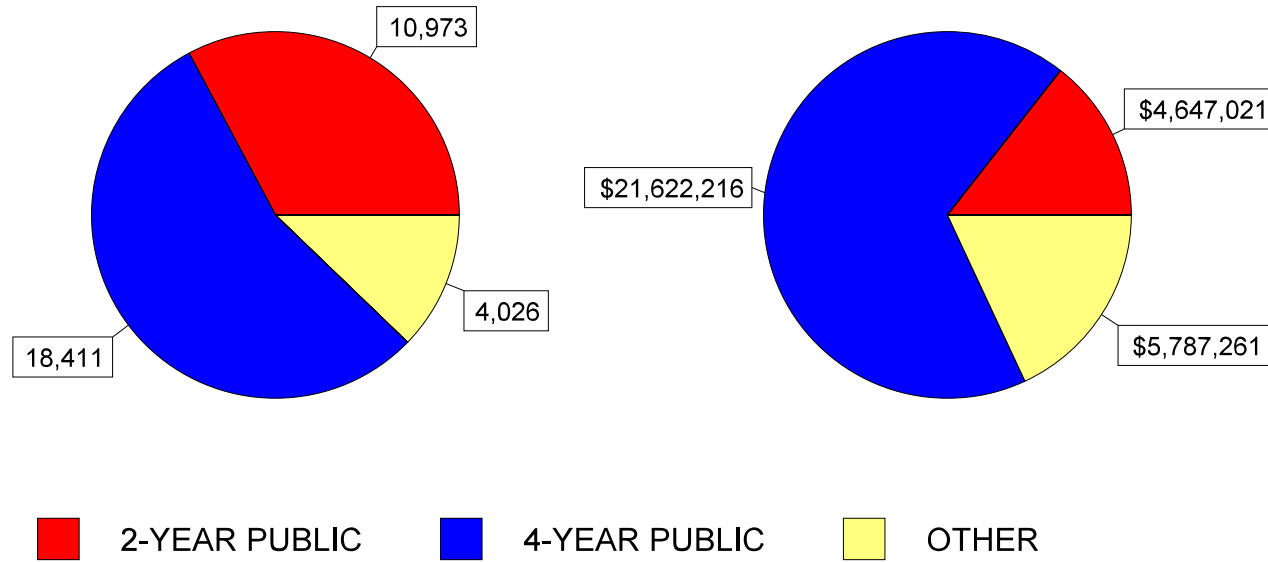

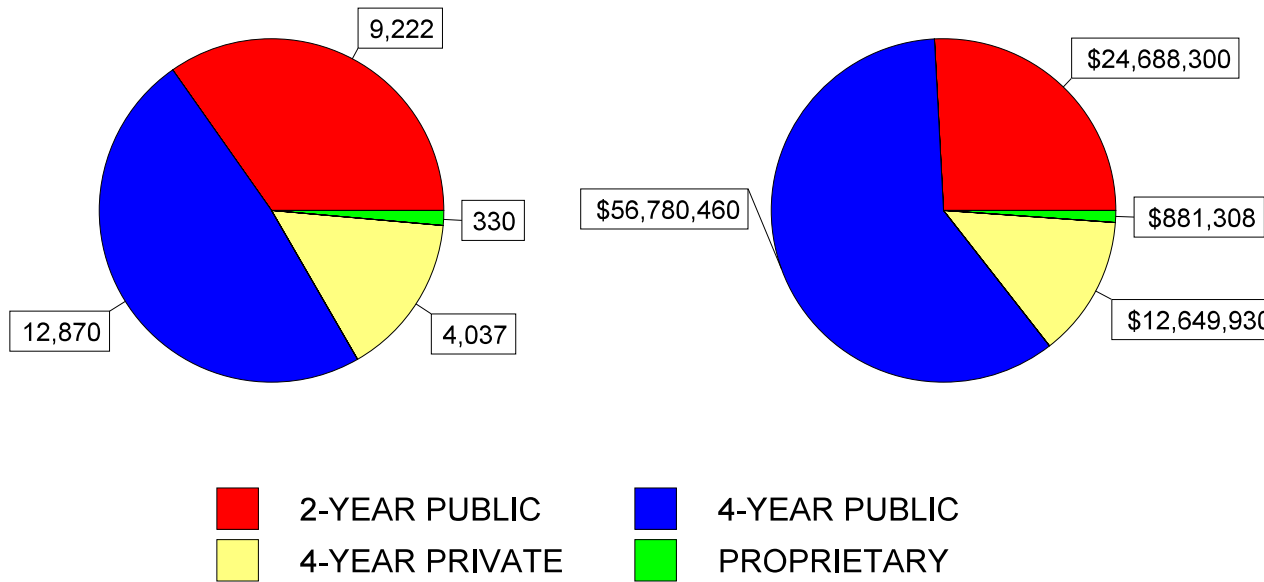

 Recipients Expenditures



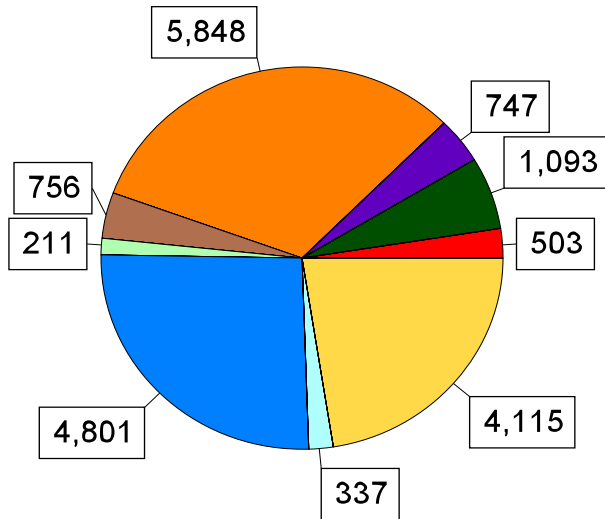

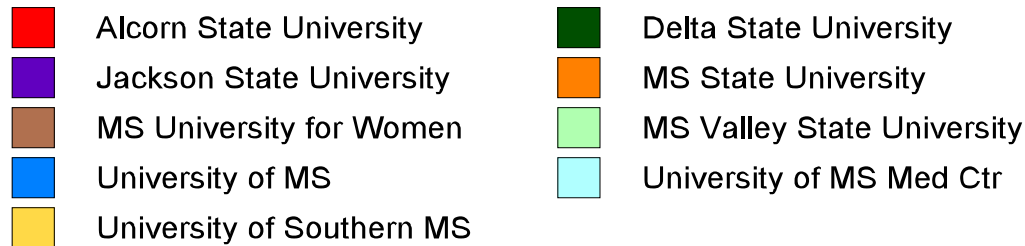
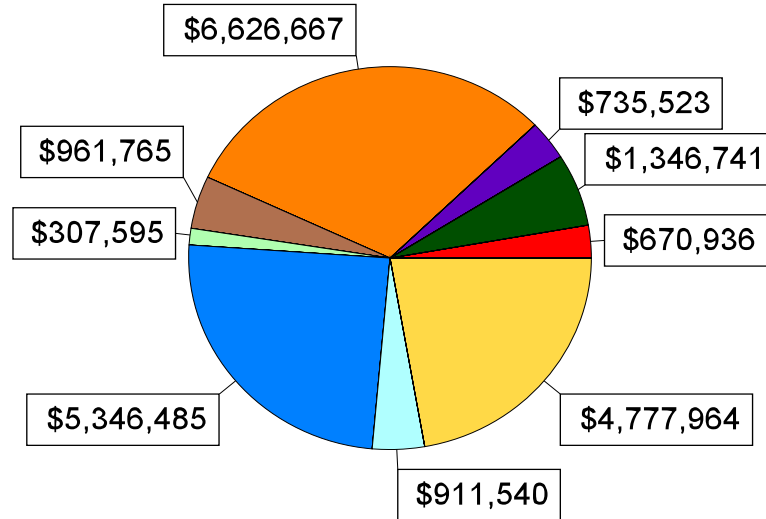

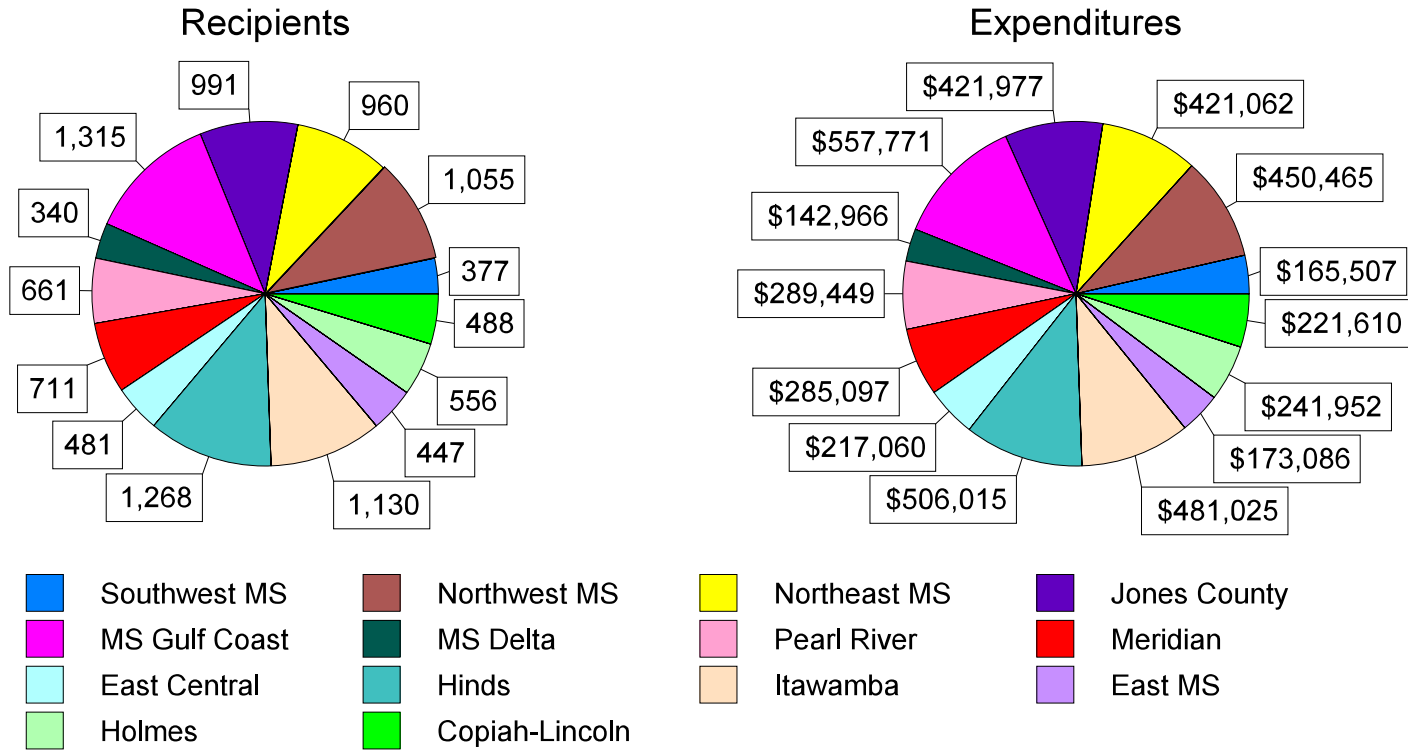

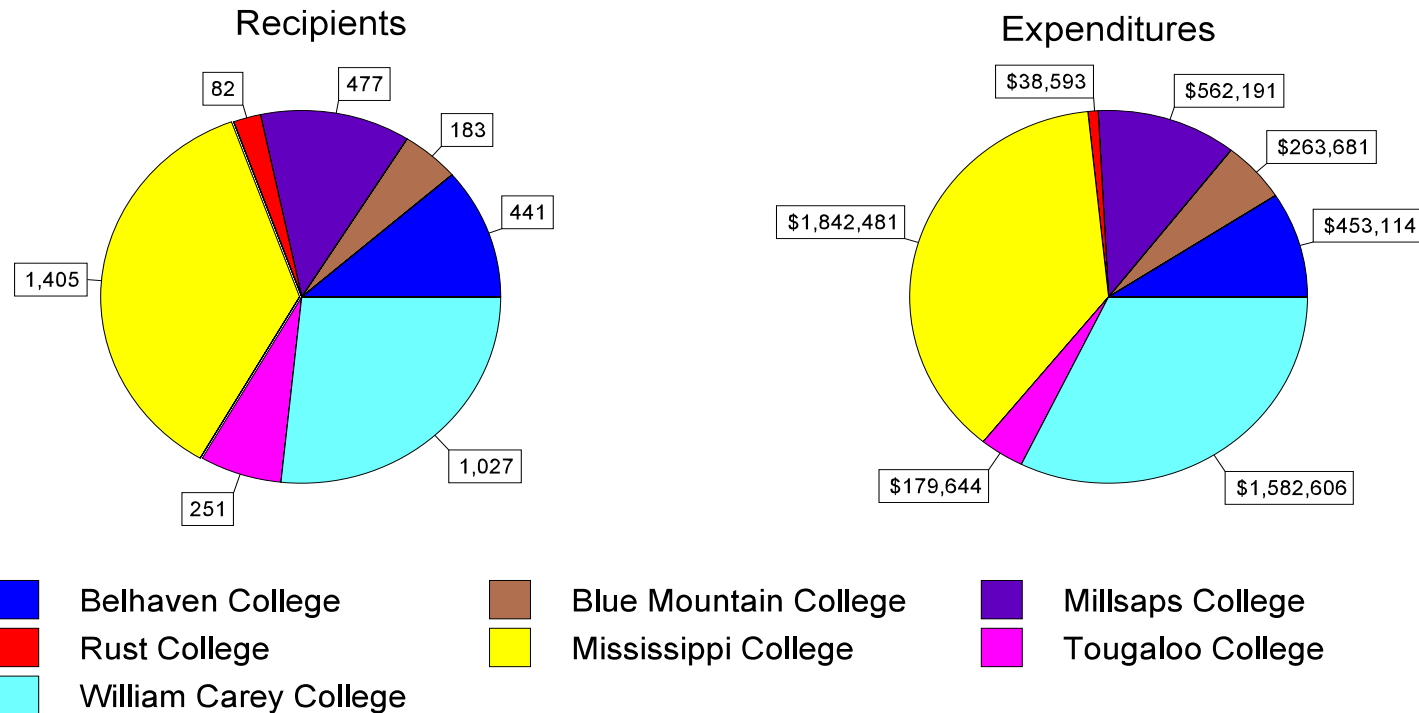
Fiscal Year 2006 Selected 2-Year Public

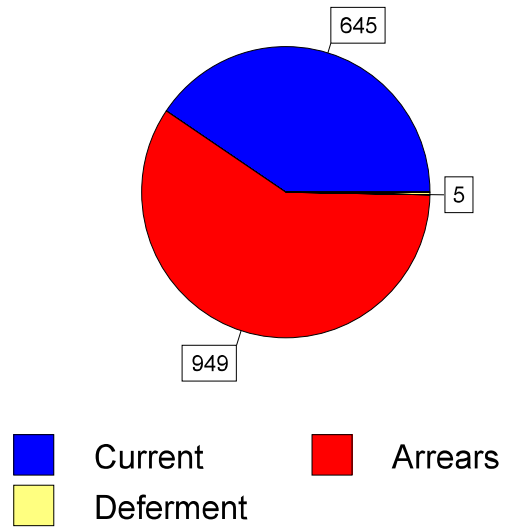

Mississippi Student Financial Aid FY 2006 Overview of Repayment

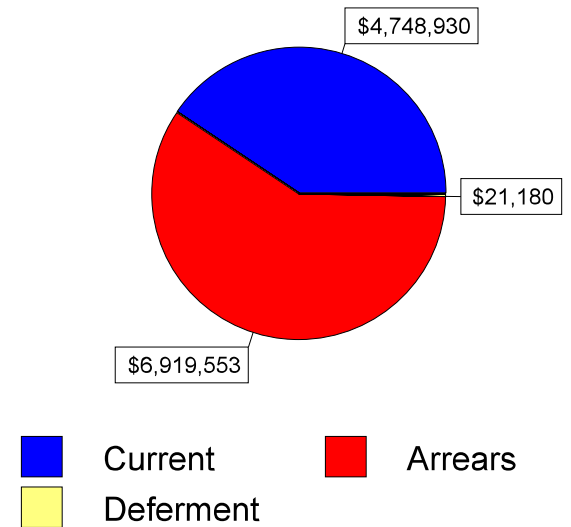
FY 2006 Repayment
