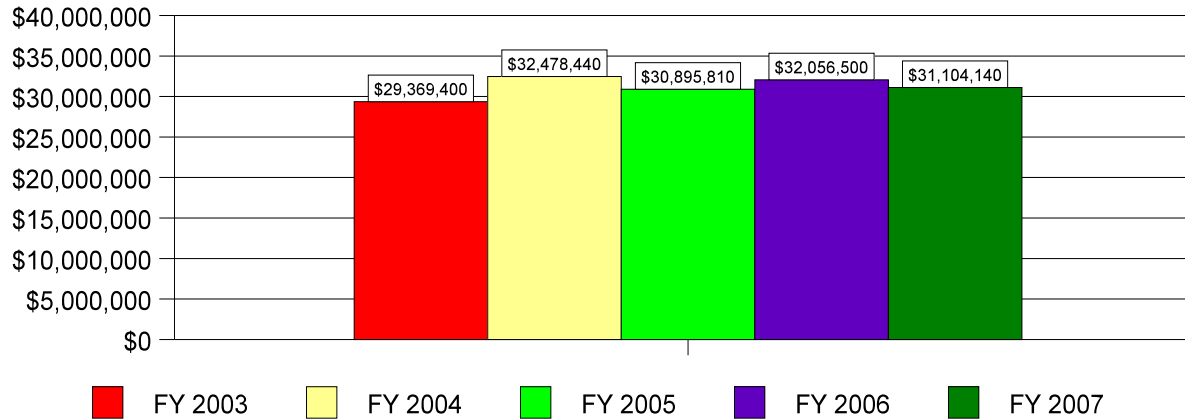

FY 03 to FY 07 Dollars awarded were up 5.91%

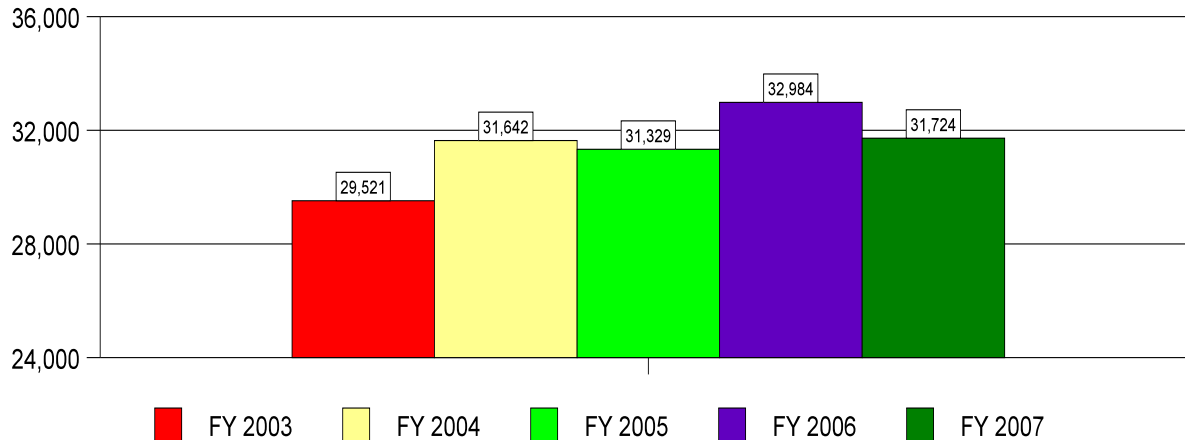


This chart reflects a comparison of expenditures for FY 2003 through FY 2007.

The average State Financial Aid award for FY 2007 was \$980.46.

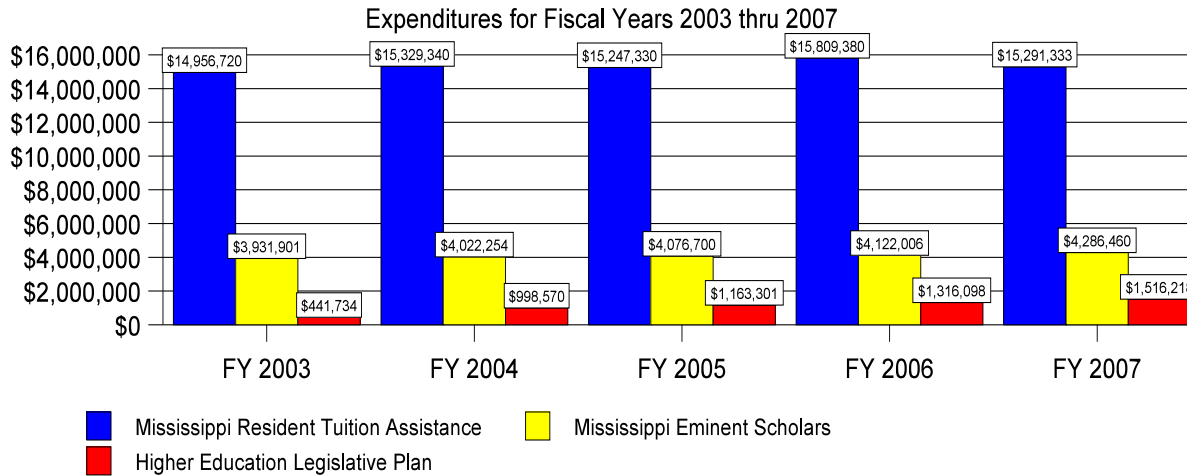
Mississippi Student Financial Aid

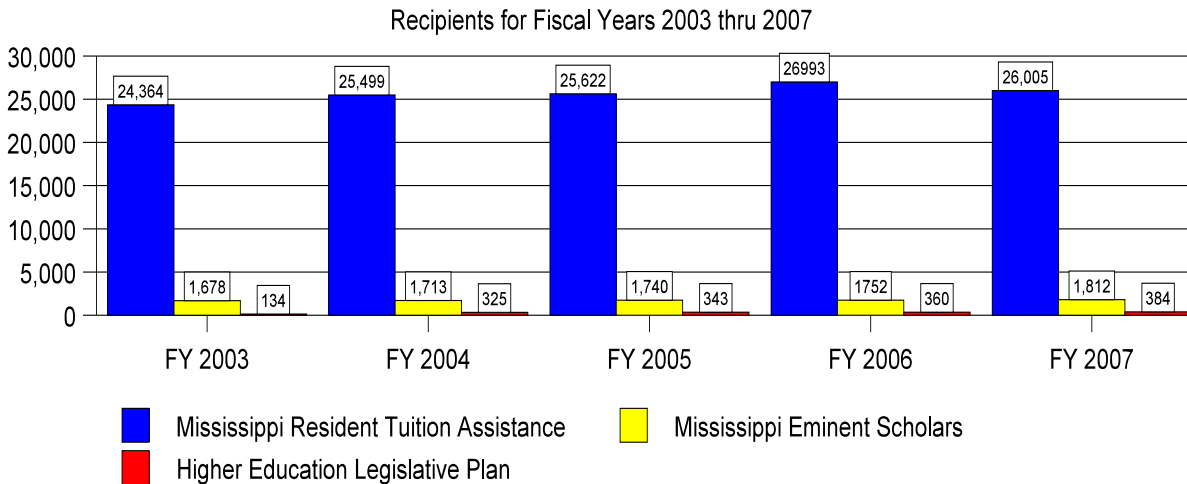
This chart reflects a comparison of expenditures for FY 2003 through FY 2007.

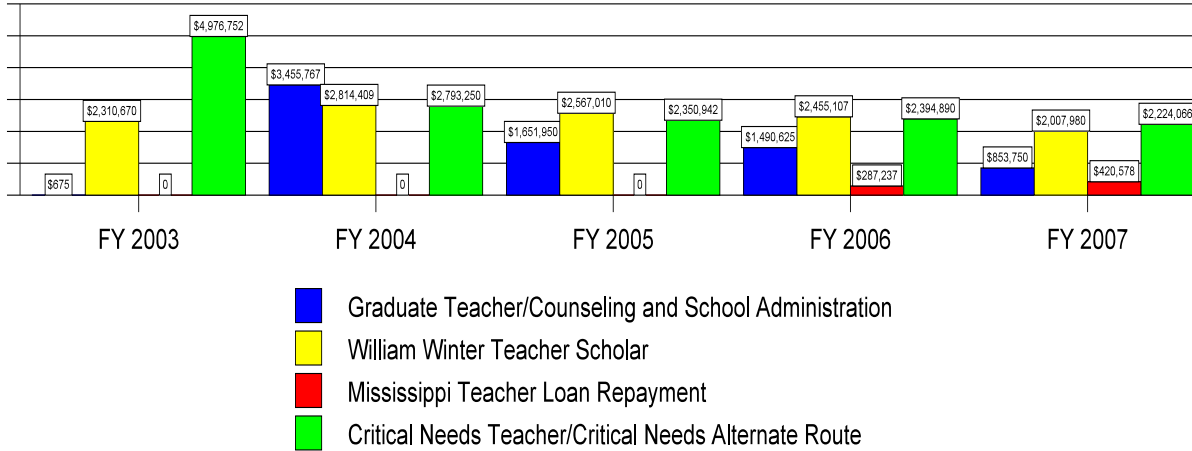

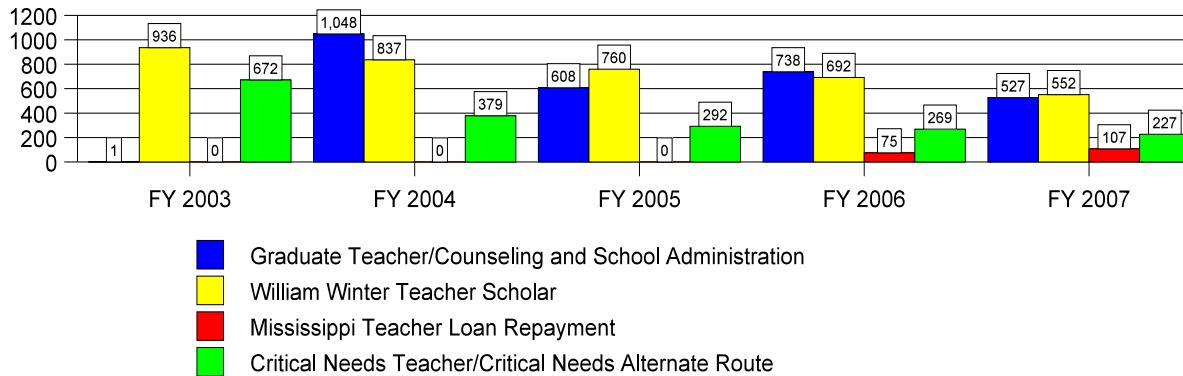

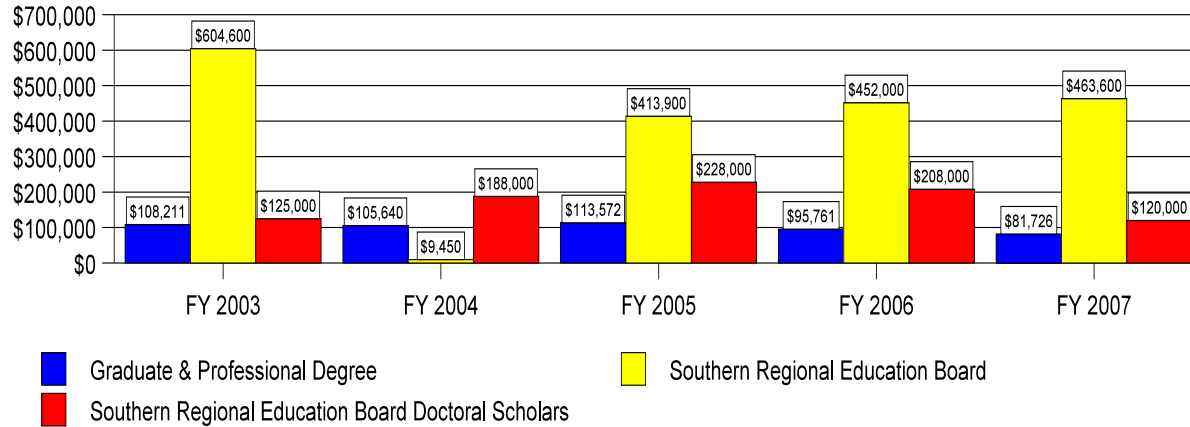
Recipients for Fiscal Years 2003 thru 2007

This chart reflects a comparison of expenditures FY 2003 through FY 2007.

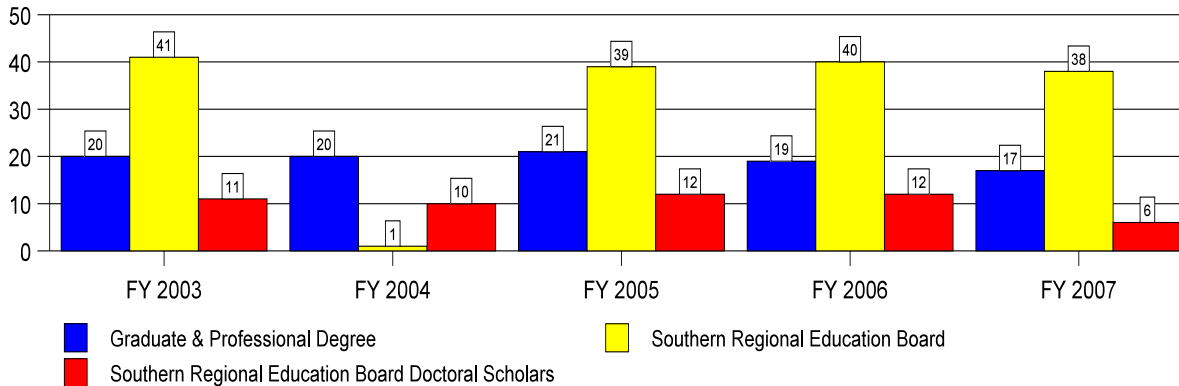

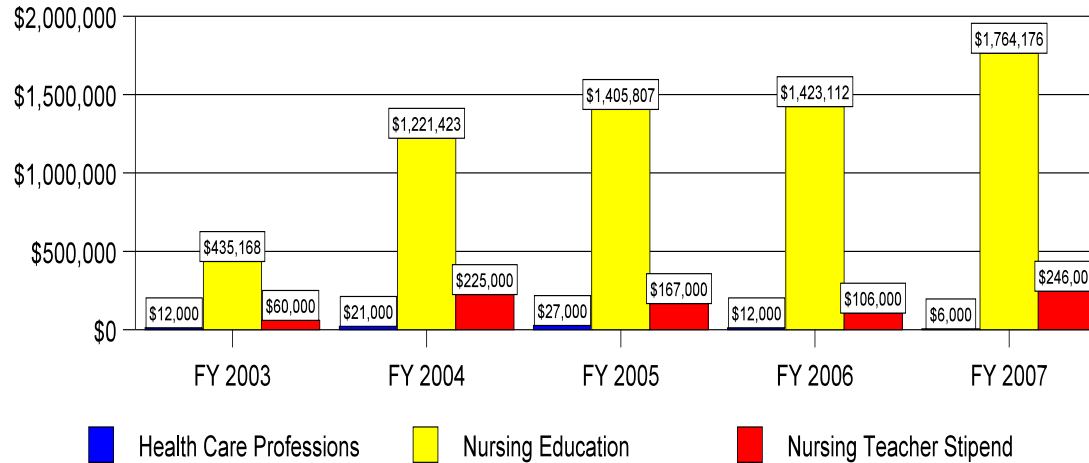
Recipients for Fiscal Years 2003 thru 2007

This chart reflects a comparison of expenditures for FY 2003 through FY 2007.

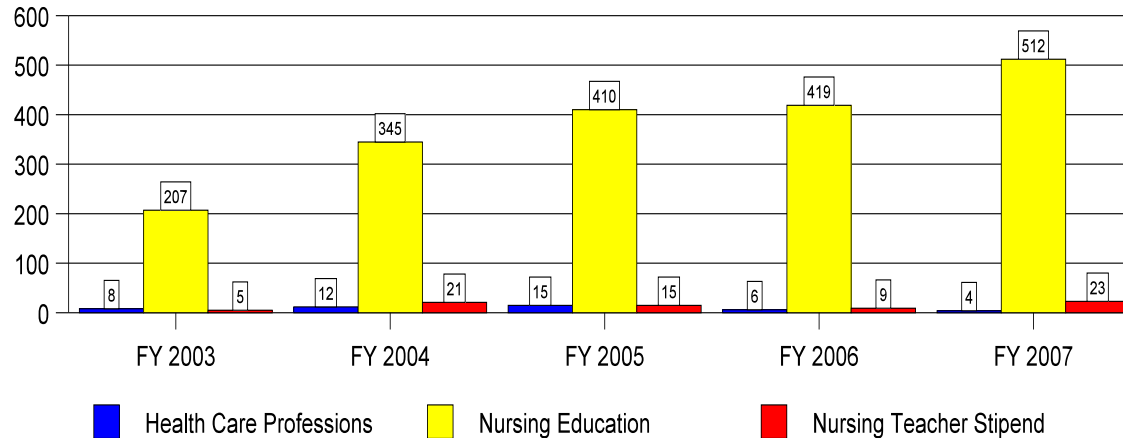

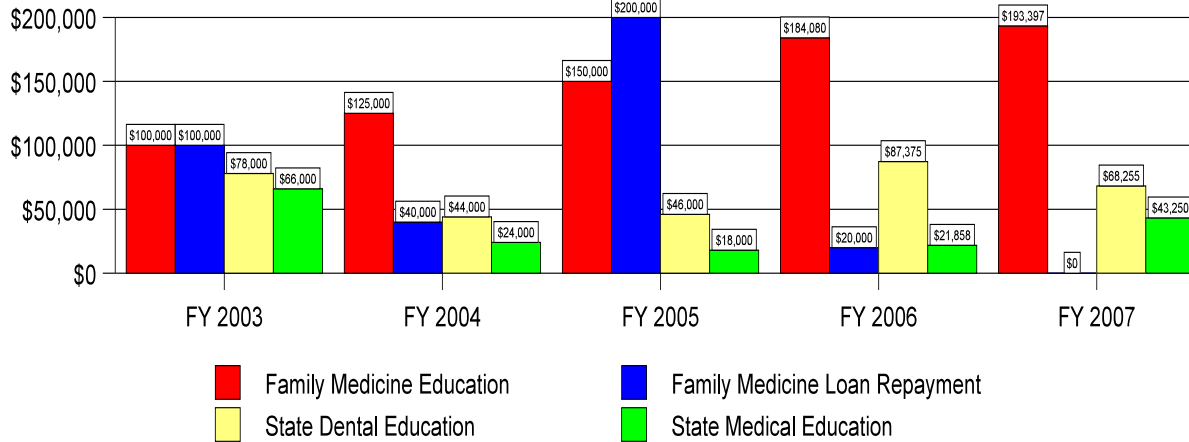
Recipients for Fiscal Years 2003 thru 2007

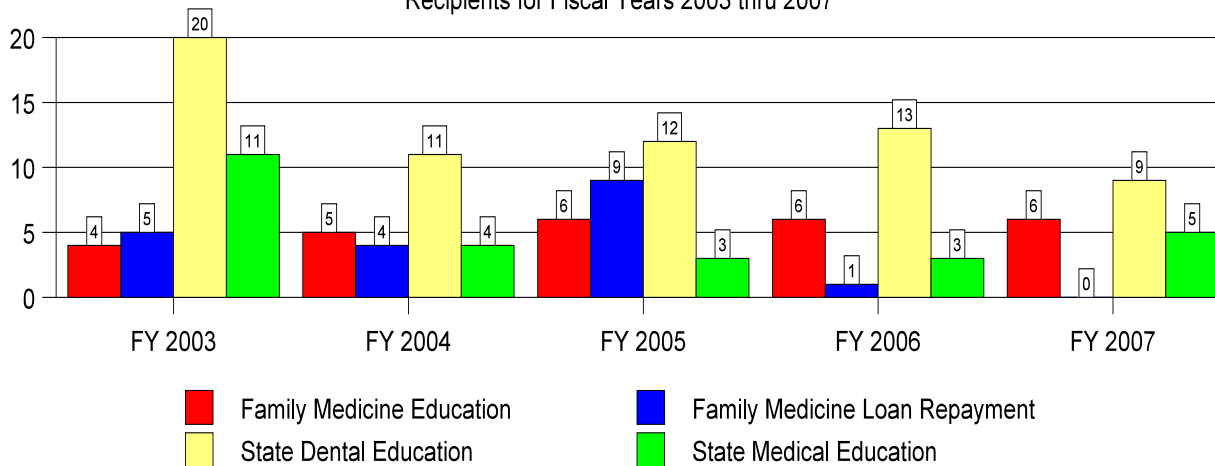

Recipients for Fiscal Years 2003 thru 2007



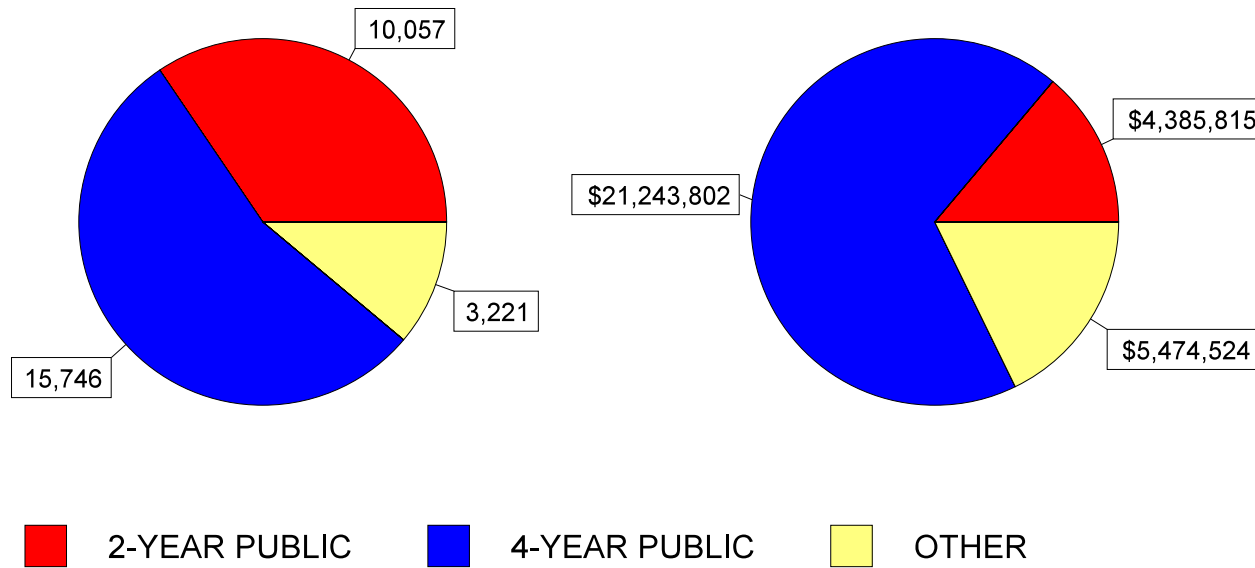

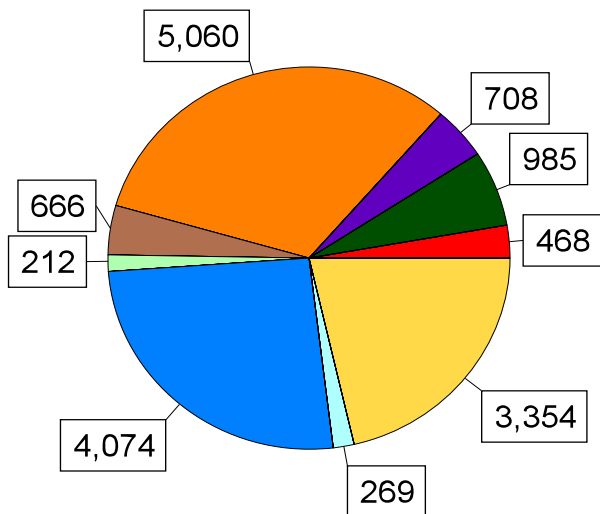

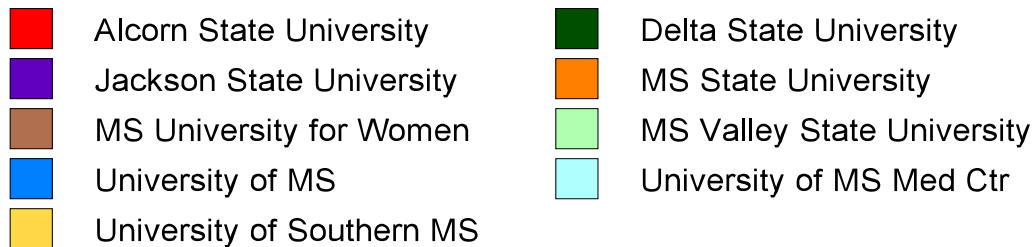
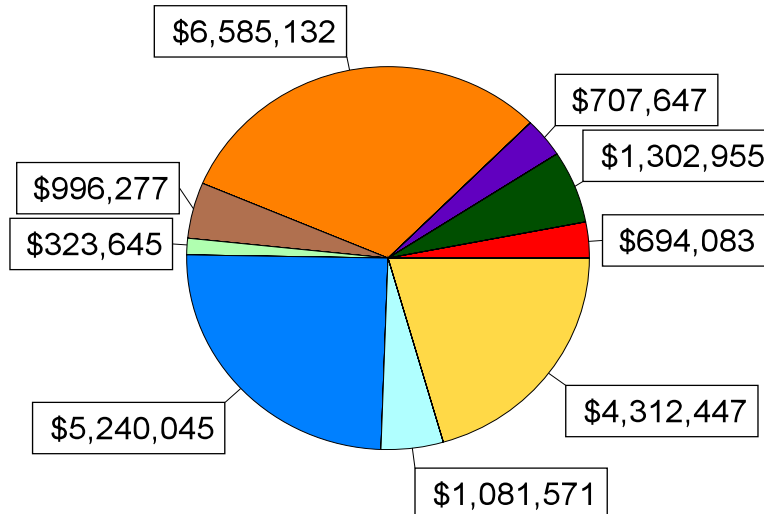

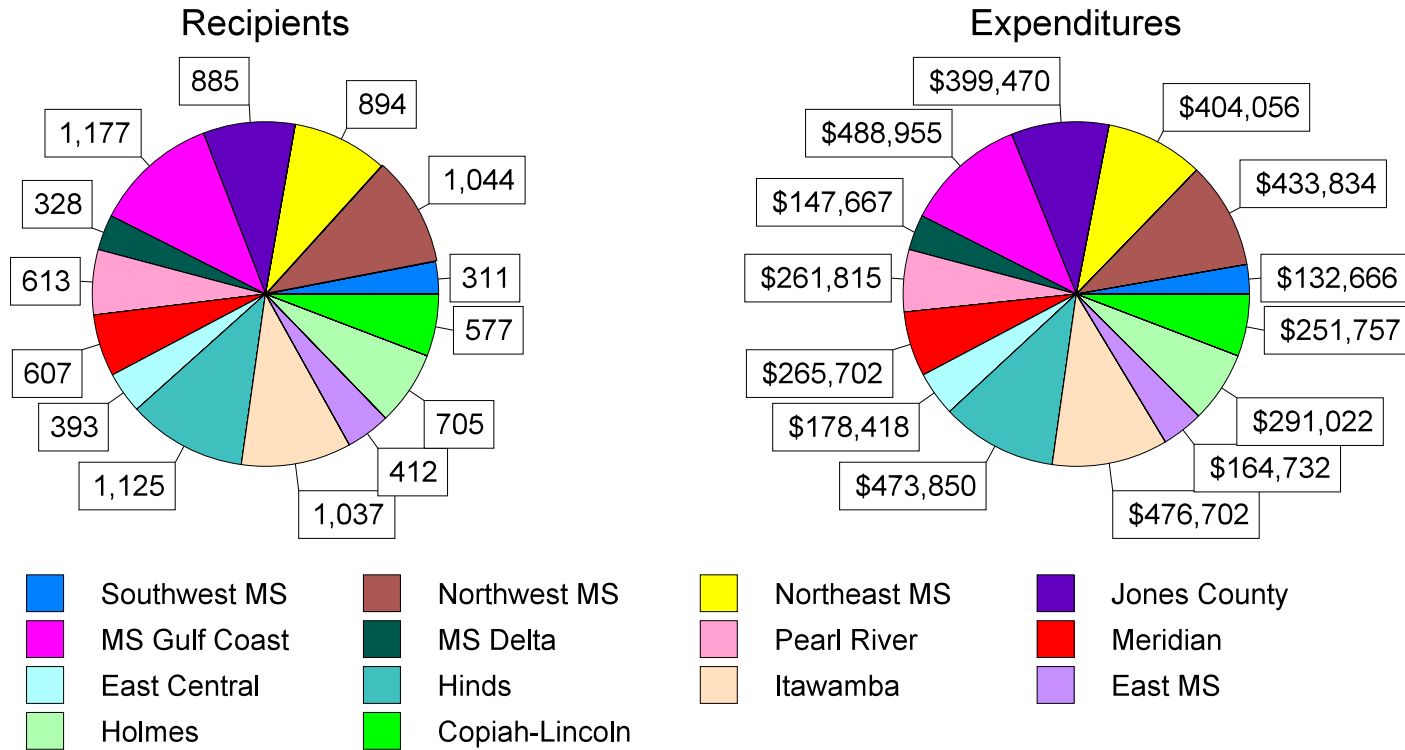

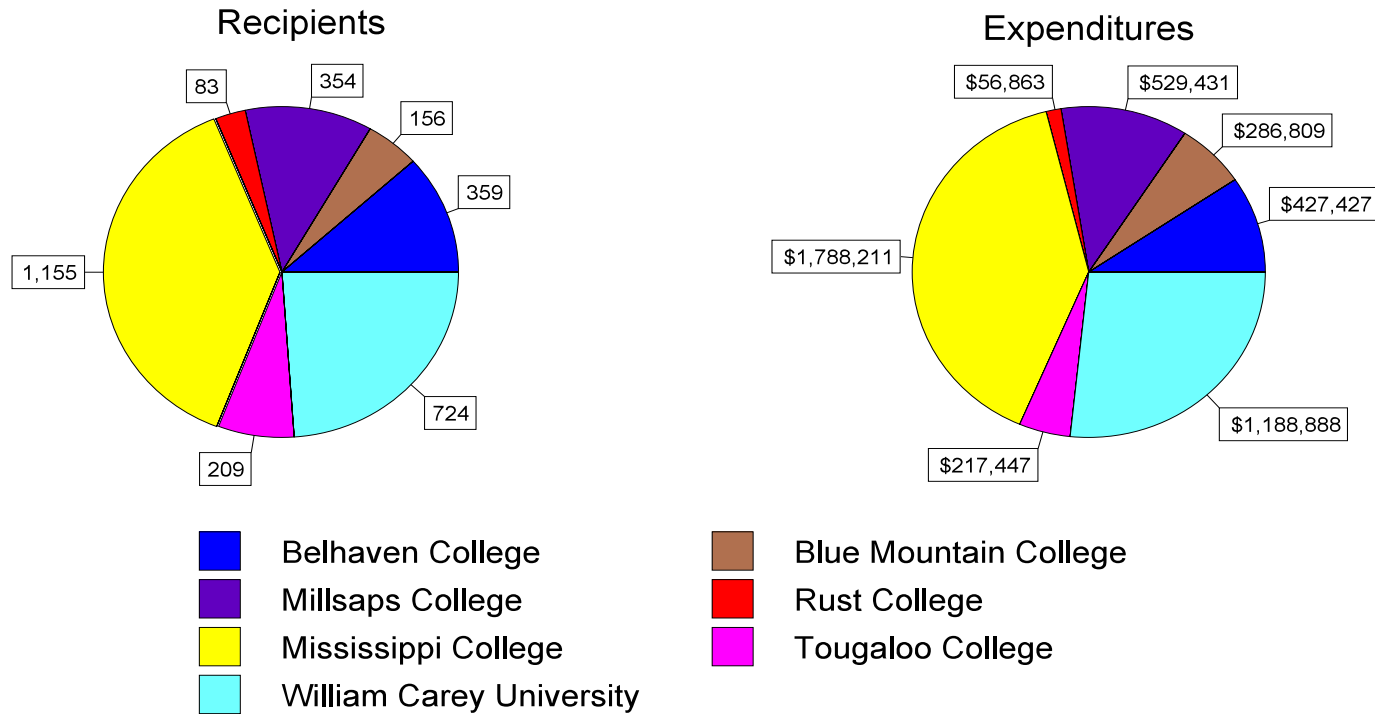
Fiscal Year 2007 Selected 2-Year Public

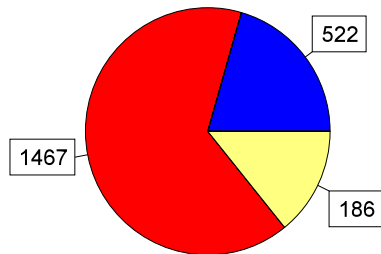

Mississippi Student Financial Aid FY 2007 Overview of Repayment

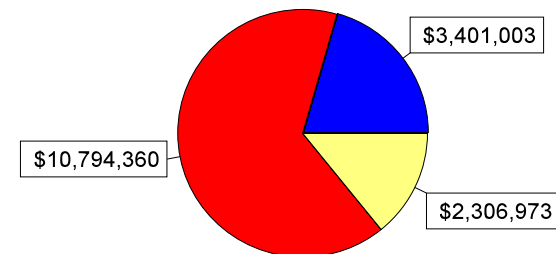
FY 2007 Repayment
